The mission of the Historic US Route 20 Association is to identify and preserve the cultural importance of the cities, small towns and rural communities along all present and former alignments of Highway 20. History

Route 20 reveals the broad scope of American expansion from an early Native American trail to the very first National Park—Yellowstone. Travelers can connect with history by visiting the homes of Presidents Grant and Garfield, stand in the place where Lincoln once debated Douglas, and even experience where the first Women's Rights Convention was held.



Natural Wonders

Traverse the rolling hills of New England, take in the striking beauty of the Finger Lakes as well as the grandeur of the Great Lakes, experience inspiring possibilities of the wide open farm lands of the Great Plains, cross high mountain sage brush deserts, climb the Rocky Mountains and Cascades before they reach the shores of the Pacific.





Small Towns

FINDING HISTORIC US ROUTE 20

Since its original designation in 1925, US Route 20 has in some locations been moved, rerouted or relocated. Every effort is being made by the organization to locate and indentify these former alignments. This effort is achieved by consulting old maps, news articles, documents from highway officials and photographs. 

HISTORIC US ROUTE 20 SIGNAGE

Is your town on US Route 20?

Did Route 20 run through your town, but was relocated?

Our grass roots mission to promote Historic Route 20 is to work with the local town & state governments to identify and recognize the route that is America's longest highway.

There are typically three ways to get Historic Route 20 signs placed on your town roads.

- 1. If the road that is or was US Route 20 is maintained by the town or county, a local ordinance or vote to establish the erecting of the signs is typically all that will be required.
- 2. If the road that is US Route 20 is maintained by the state, then legislation needs to be sponsored and passed or state highway department permission is likely required to place signage on such routes.
- 3. Private property owners can erect the signs just off of the State DOT right of way on their own land. The towns may also wish to erect such signs on their own property adjacent to the highway.

The original 1926 alignment may still be the current US Route 20 highway,

The Historic US Route 20 Association will provide your community with a detailed history of Route 20, historical maps and promotional materials for your review. A presentation to town officials can also be prepared.

Placement of the signage will be delegated to the town with recommendations from the Association – if a historic alignment exists in the town, we strongly urge placement on this road.

Each sign is an official reflective highway grade sign measuring 24"x 36". The signs feature the original 1926 shield design, with specific state name, on a brown back ground. The design is the same used to designate Historic Route 66.

The cost of the sign is a donation of \$100 each to the Historic US Route 20 Association and is tax deductible. The donation helps cover the cost of the sign(s) and promotion on both our website and forthcoming mobile travel app.

The Historic Route 20 Association can or will place a QR code stamp on the back of each sign. This stamp can be scanned by persons with a smart phone to learn more about the location of where the sign is placed.

The town is responsible for erecting costs, poles, hardware and labor, unless otherwise negotiated.

Smaller signs are available for reassurance guidance. We recommend two (facing east and west) large signs for placement on the highway in each community.


The Historic Route 20 Passport and Stamp Program is designed to engage travelers and tourists on their adventure across US Route 20.






